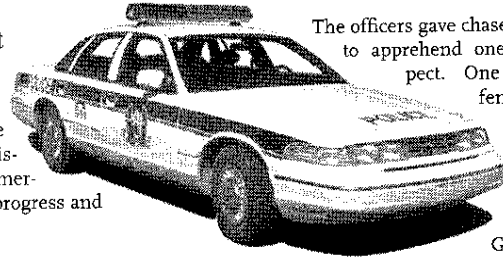
NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME

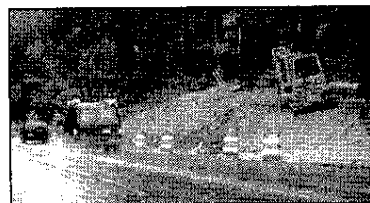
Given the time commitment required of squad members, it's hard to believe that Joan has a life outside the rescue squad, but
